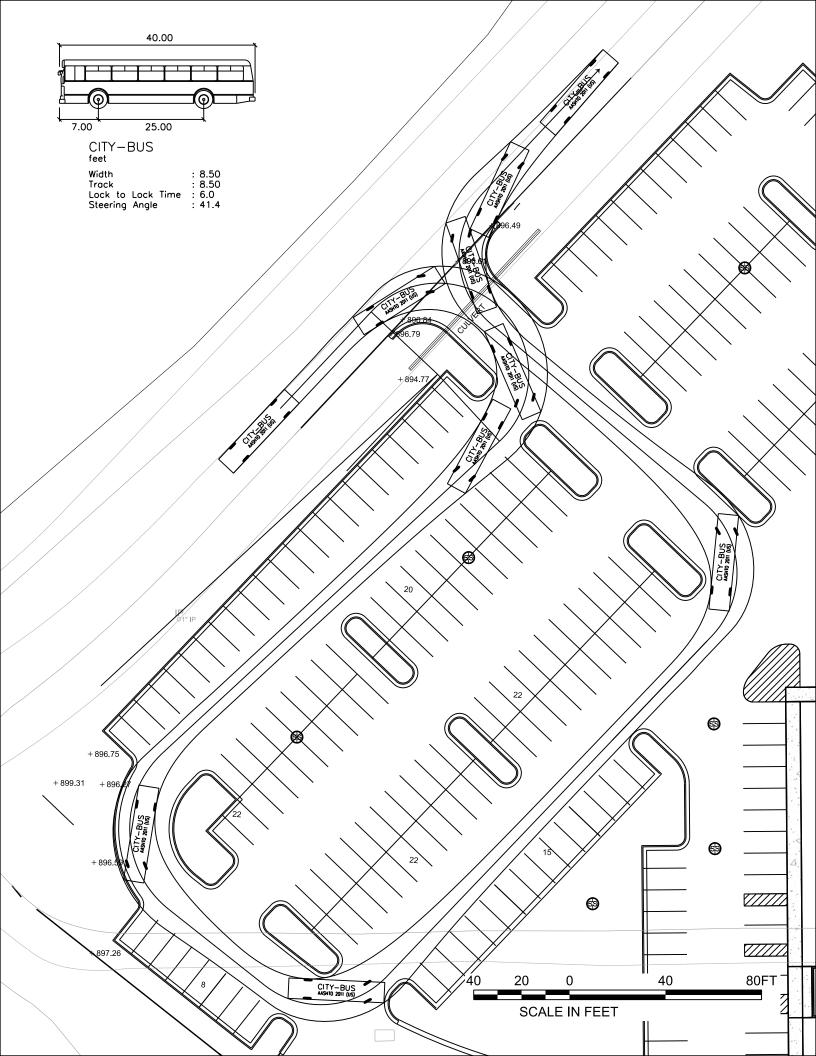

## **BOOKS ON BUS PROGRAM**

I received a request from the transit system in Fon Du Lac for information about the program. Someone from their community was visiting in Eau Claire and saw the books on our buses.

Drivers are not reporting any concerns on their end. Shelly has reported that on average, they have replaced 53 books/week. She says that the majority of the books used have been the children's books. We are trying to figure out how we can get something at the Transfer Center that will work for us and the Library.

## **CITY BUDGET**

The budget will be voted on at the November 14<sup>th</sup> City Council Meeting. Notices were placed on all the buses and at the Transfer Center once the Agenda for the Public Hearing regarding the budget was finalized. (A copy of the notice has been included in your packet). I will update the commission on the results of the council's actions on the city budget and its effect on Transit at our meeting.

## TRANSFER CENTER PROJECT

The application for the TIGER Grant was delivered in time and we are following its status on Grants.gov. There are several levels of review, but as applications advance, the reviewers often will contact systems for clarification of items in the application. It is still too early to know where our application is at in the review process. After submitting the application, we received a letter of Support from the Minnesota Department of Transportation. We contacted the USDOT to see if we could still include it with the application and they said that we should mail it directly to them. I have included a copy of this letter in your packet.

The Council members have been informed that the Eau Claire Transit Commission **voted down a motion to recommend** that the council increase the Transit Fees and Licenses Schedule that is part of the current budget proposal.
