Eau Claire Fire & Rescue News Media Report



Narrative:

On May 30 at 5:03 pm, the Eau Claire Fire Department responded to a fire at American Phoenix, 800 Wisconsin Street. 3 engines, a medic unit, and Battalion Chief responded on the first alarm. A second alarm was sounded prior to units arrival on the scene, those second alarm units included a ladder truck, heavy rescue unit, a second medic unit and command staff. First arriving units found large amounts of smoke coming from the roof and doors on the Galloway street side of the building. The fire started on the first floor and spread to the roof through the ventilation system. The building's sprinklers system kept the fire in check until firefighters could extinguish it. An aerial truck was used to get access to the roof. The fire was contained to a machine and the ventilation system. Damage is estimated to be \$25,000. Eau Claire Fire Department was assisted on scene by the Eau Claire Police Department. Township Fire Department and Altoona Fire Department each stood by at their stations.
