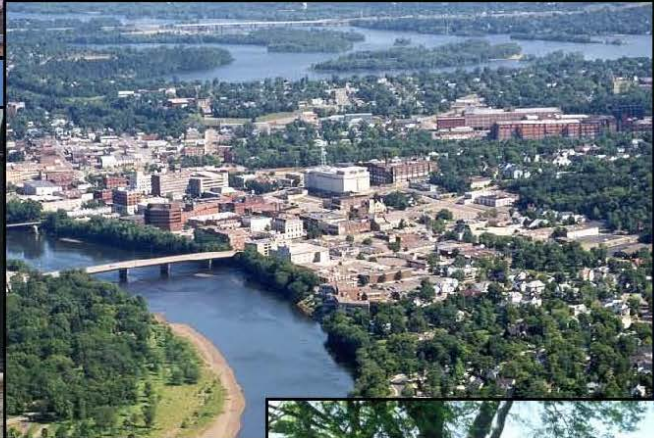


# City of Eau Claire Census 2010 Summary Report



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# INTRODUCTION

## Introduction

This report is a summary of selected information taken from the Year 2010 Census and 2005-2009 American Community Survey for the City of Eau Claire. The American Community Survey is an annual sampling of the City conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. This data replaces the “long form” data from previous censuses.

The information provided in this report pertains to that data which is frequently requested by the public and, therefore, is not a comprehensive summary of all the data that is available. The statistics in the report include basic population and housing information that was obtained from responses to the 2010 Census. In addition, more detailed data pertaining to income, education, employment, and housing values is included that was obtained from the 2005-2009 American Community Survey.

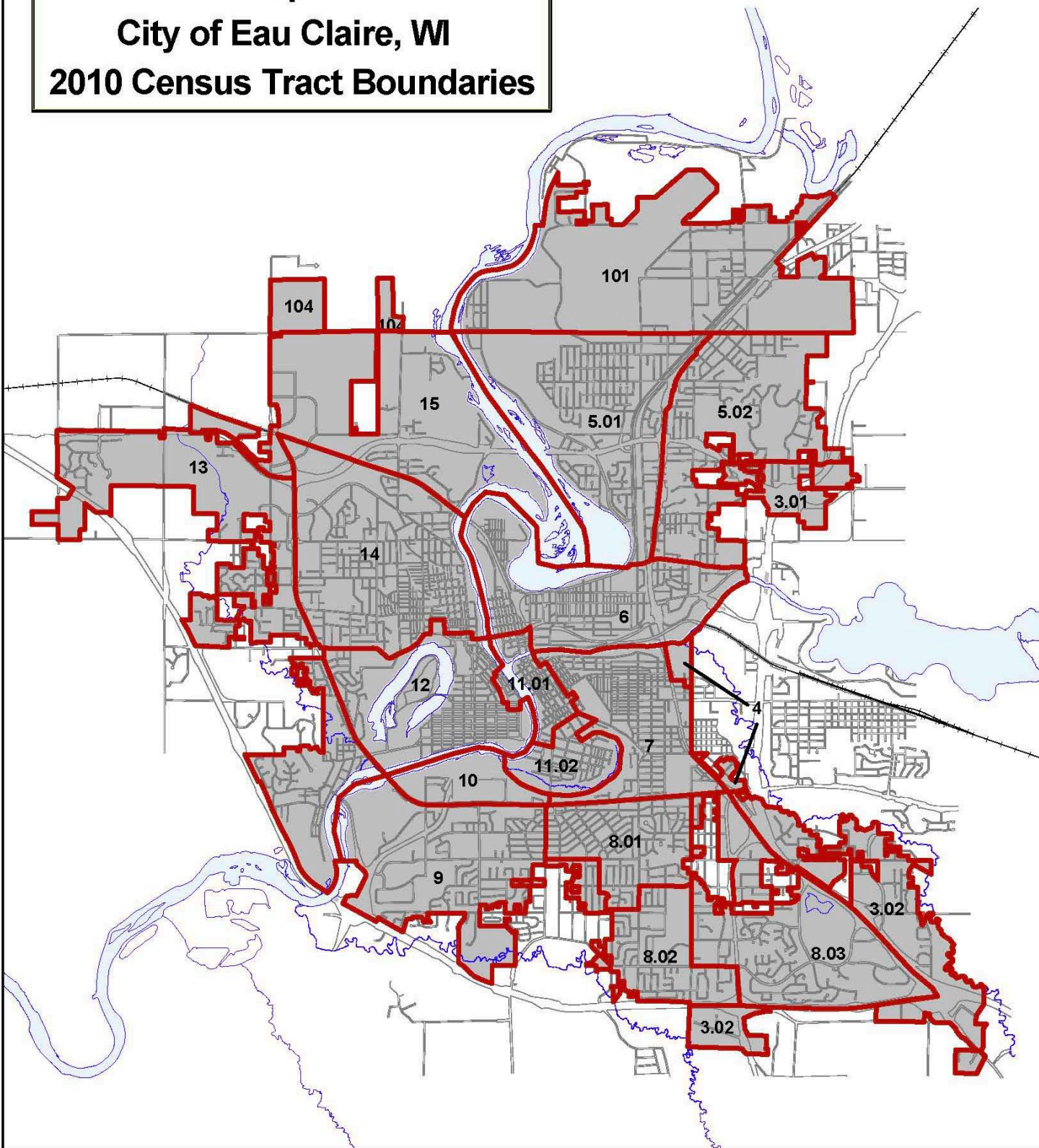
The report also provides census statistics for the City at the census tract level. A census tract is a statistical subdivision of a city created by the Census Bureau to provide census information at smaller geographical levels than just for an entire municipality. Tract boundaries generally follow major geographical features such as a river, railroad, or major highway. Map 1 illustrates the boundaries of the census tracts within the city. Most of the tracts are entirely within the city; however, some extend beyond the corporate limits and include areas outside the city. Data for these “split” tracts can be obtained for both the portion within the city and the portion outside the city. This report includes data only for the “split” portions of the tract that are within the city.

It is important to emphasize that this report focuses on only selected census statistics at the city and tract level. Additional information is available either through the City of Eau Claire or from the Census Bureau’s web site. The site is [www.census.gov](http://www.census.gov). Census information is also available at the “block group” and “block” levels. These are further subdivisions of the census tracts.

Finally, it should be noted that there are some differences in statistics gathered from the 2010 Census and from the 2005-2009 American Community Survey. These differences are due to sampling techniques used in the American Community Survey.

**2010 Census Tract Boundaries**

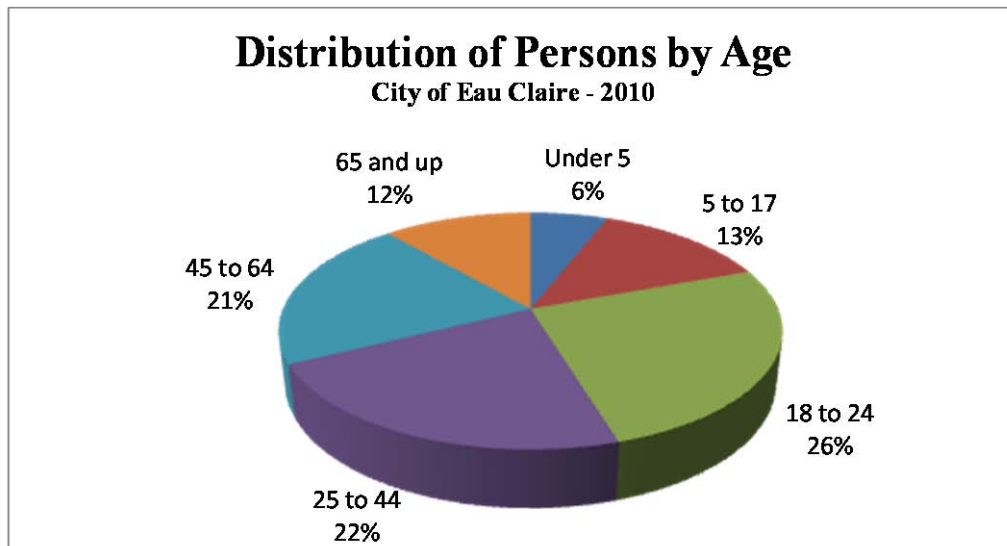

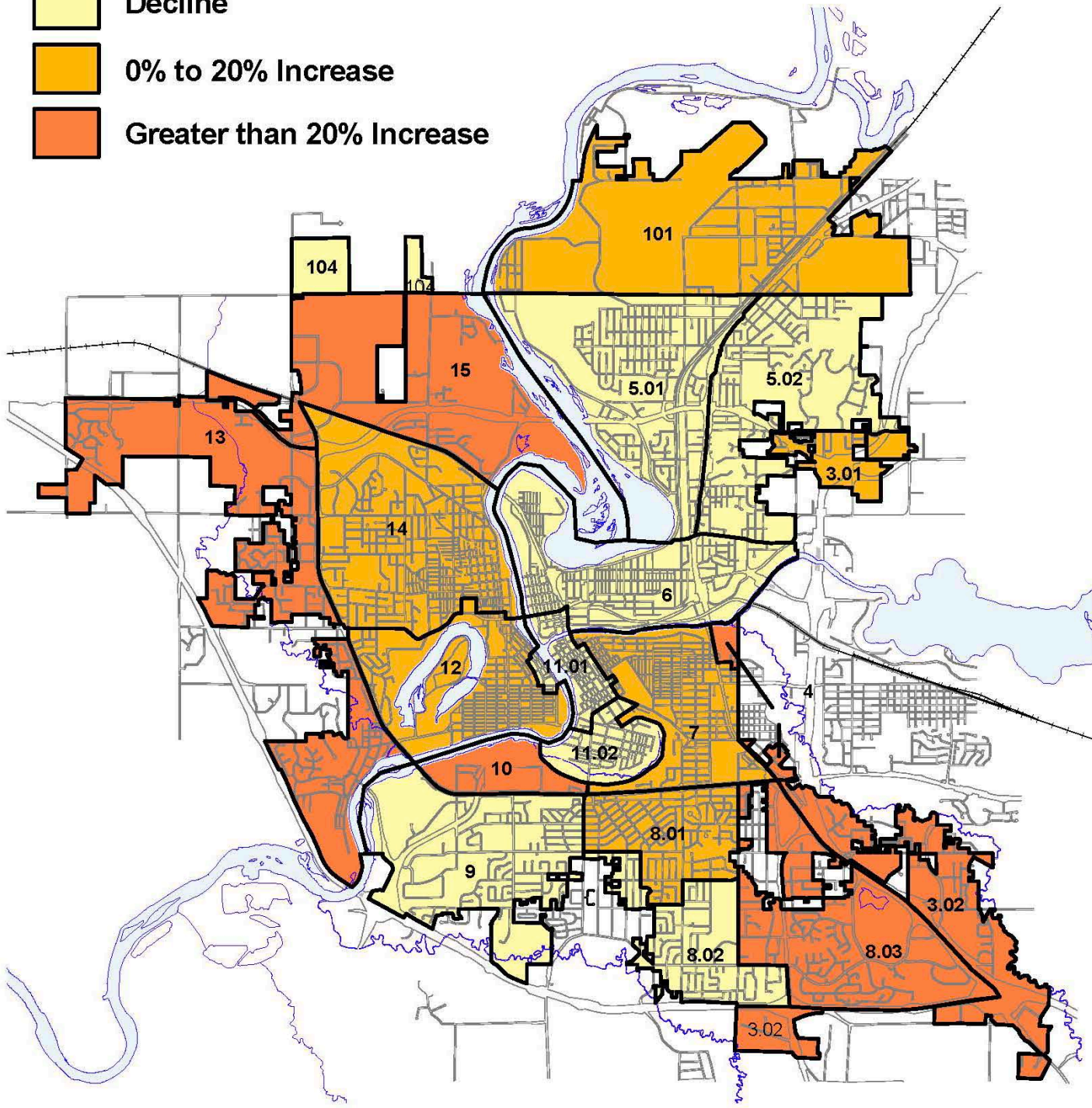

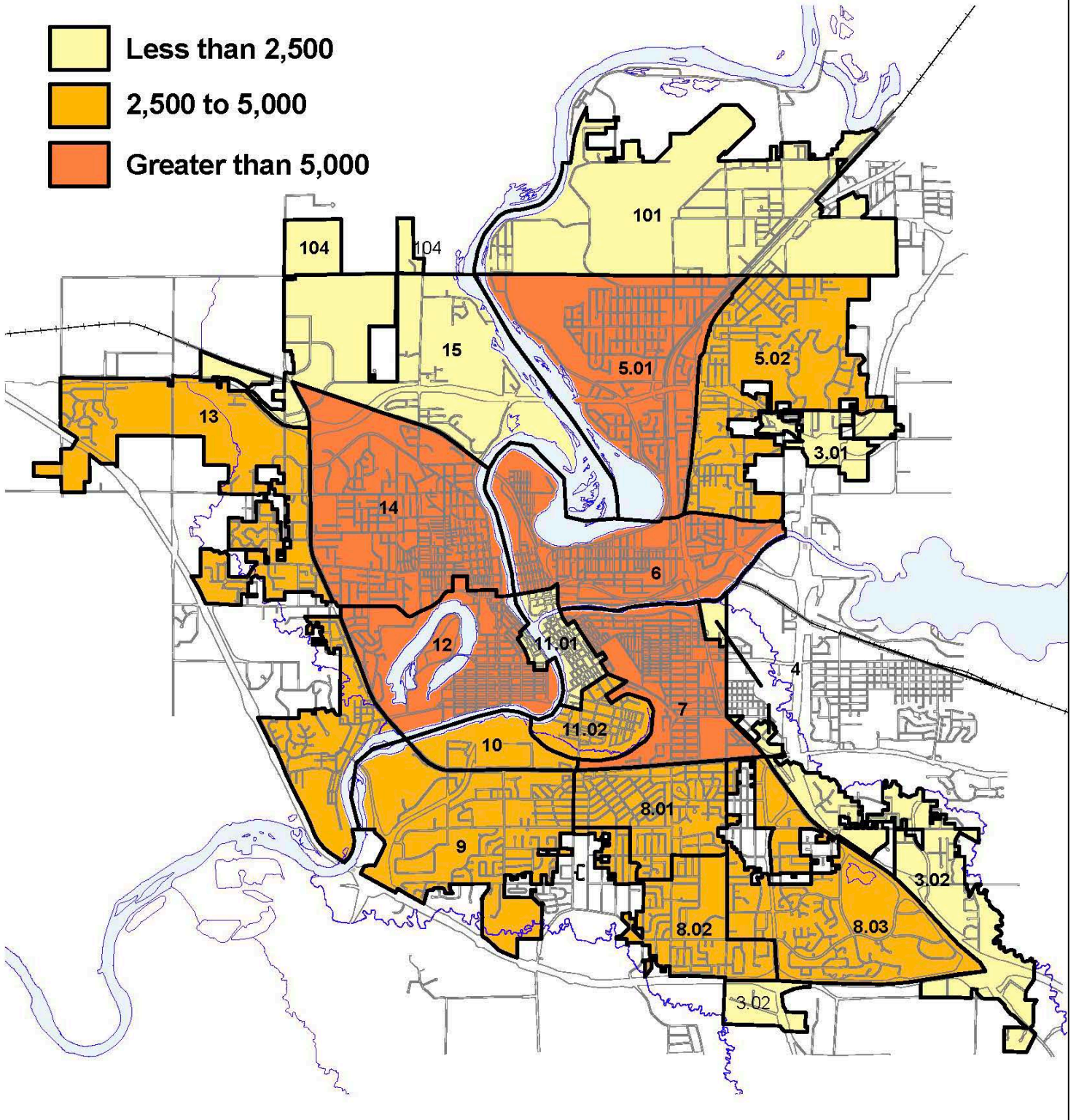
# Map 2 Percent Population Change by Census Tract 2000 to 2010

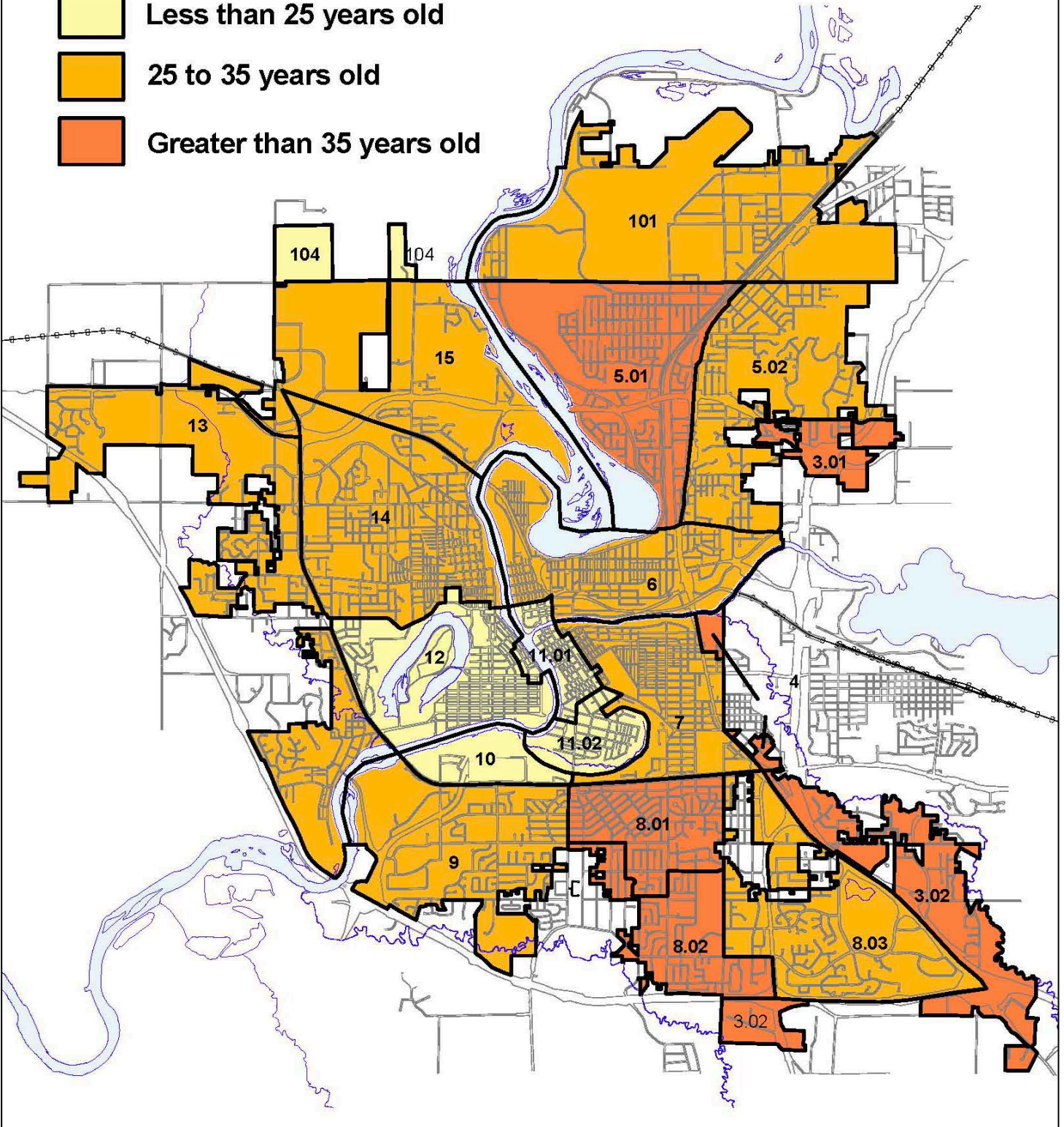

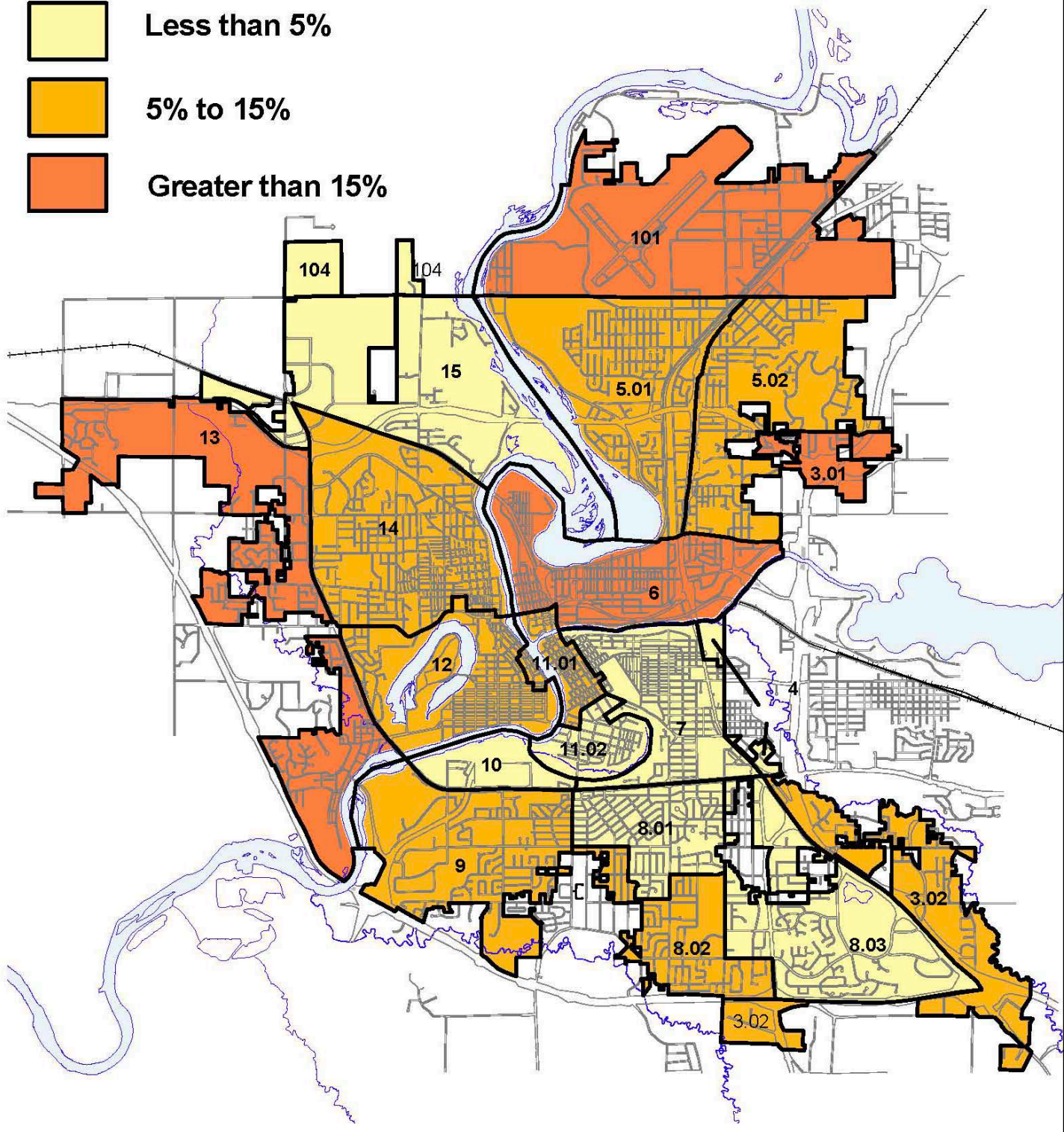
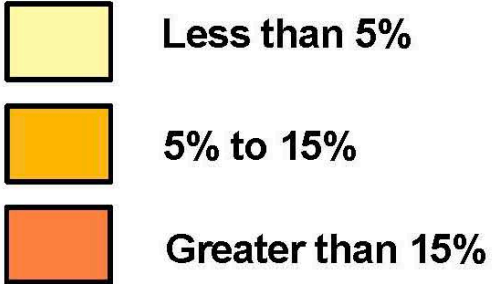

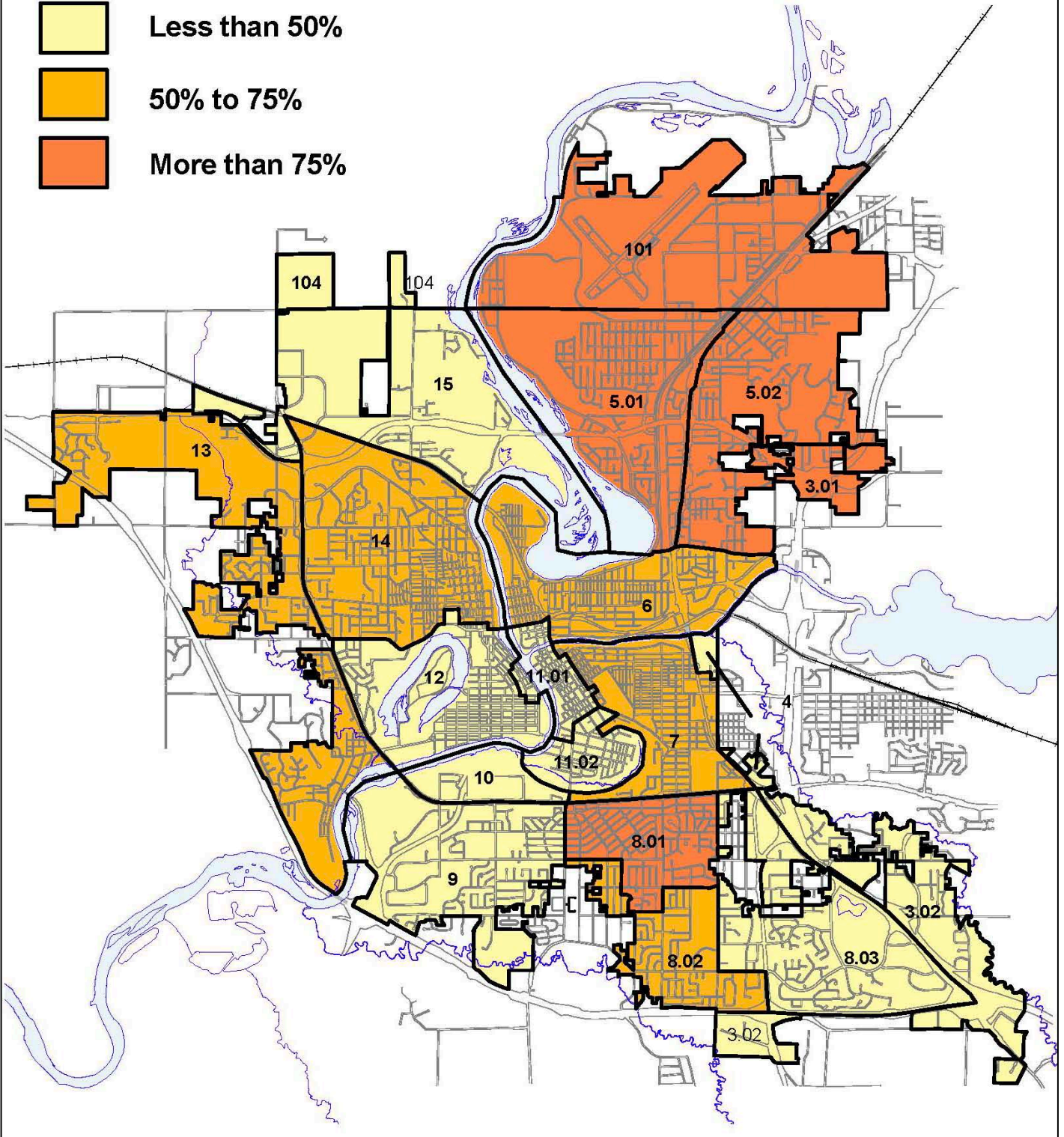
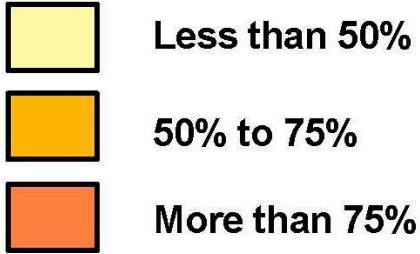



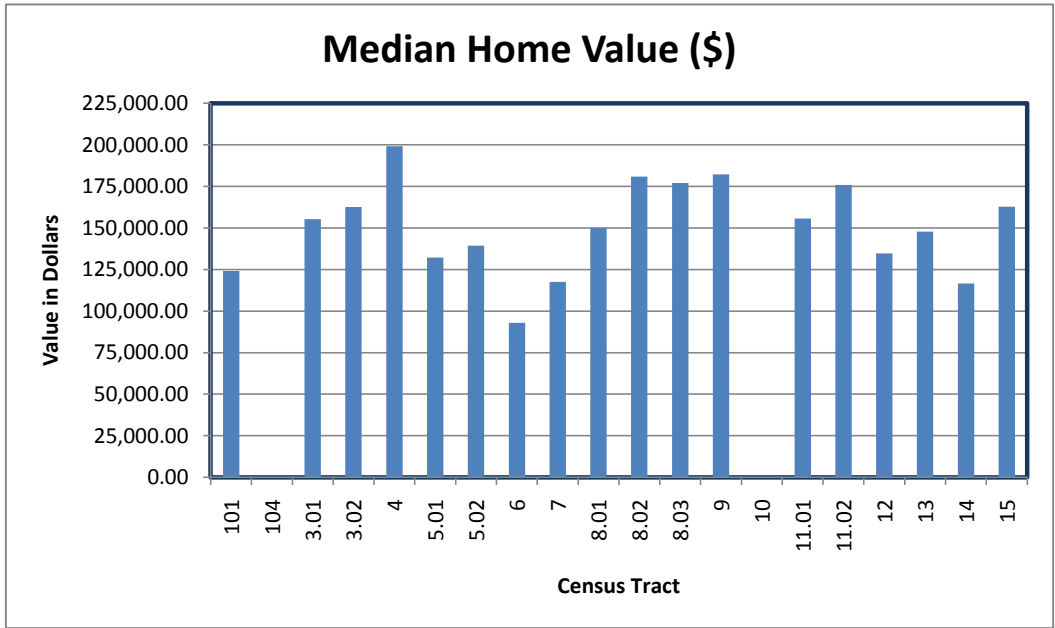

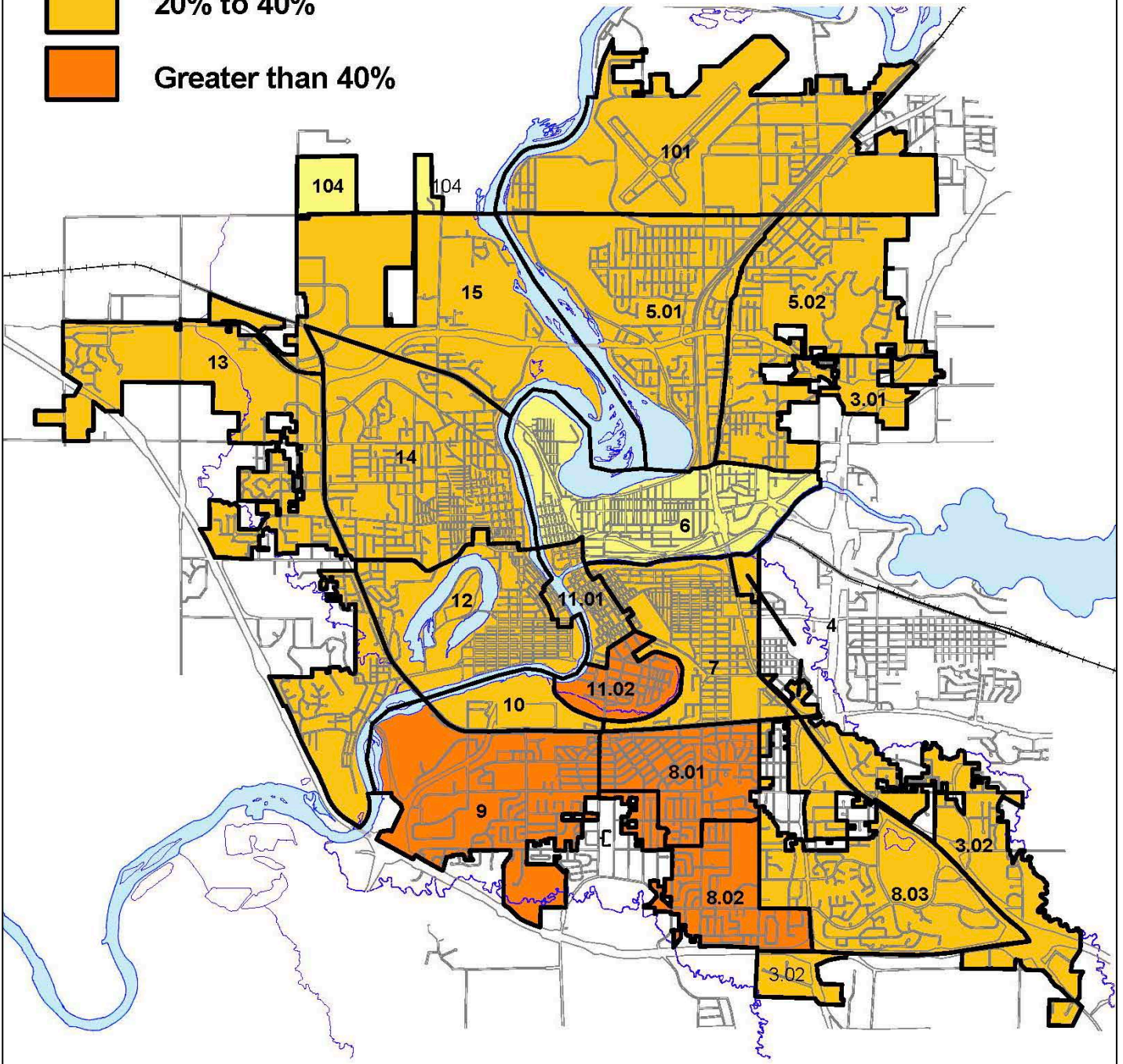
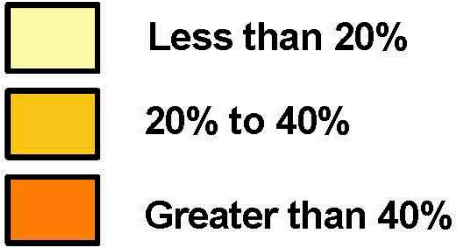

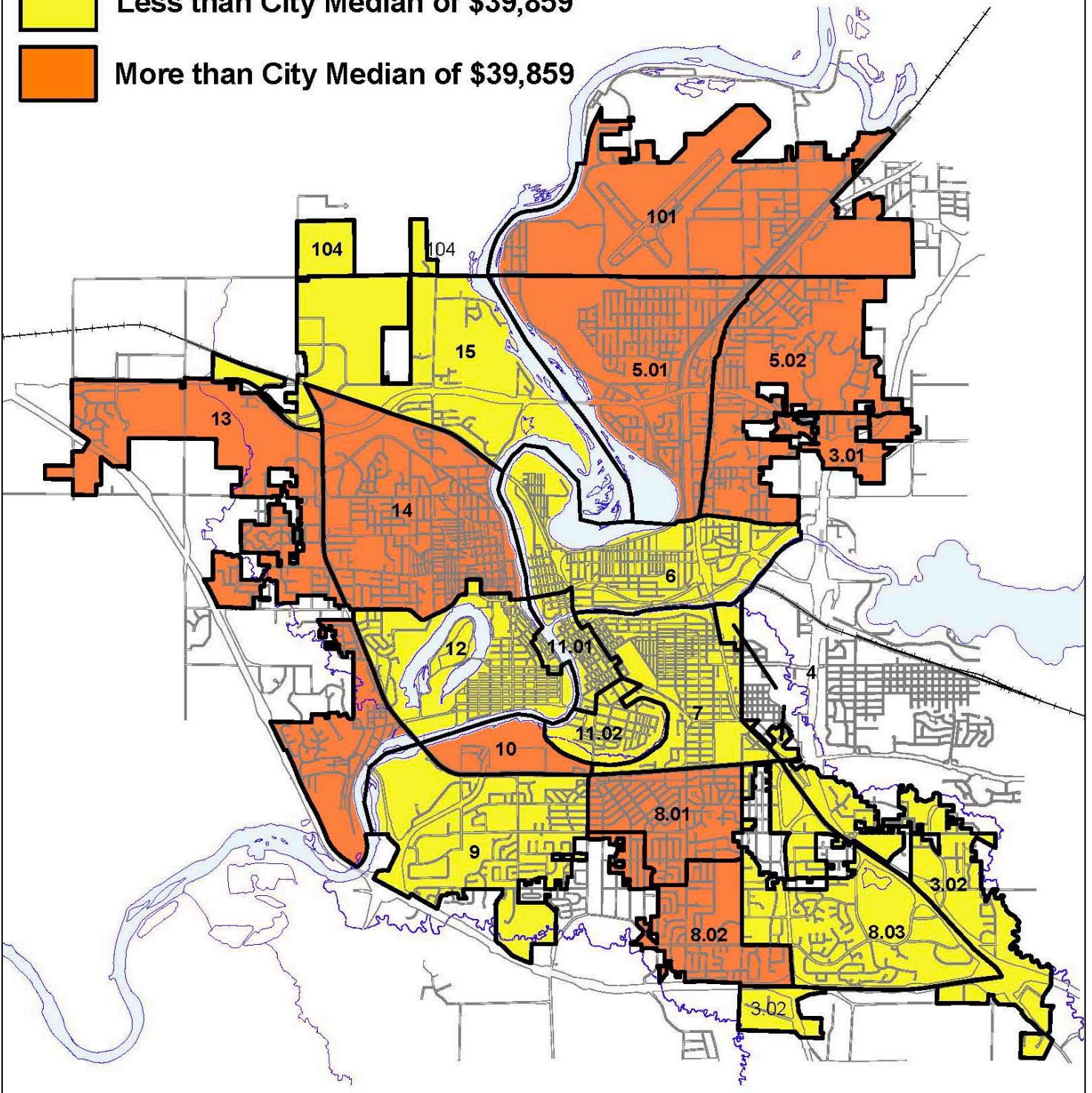

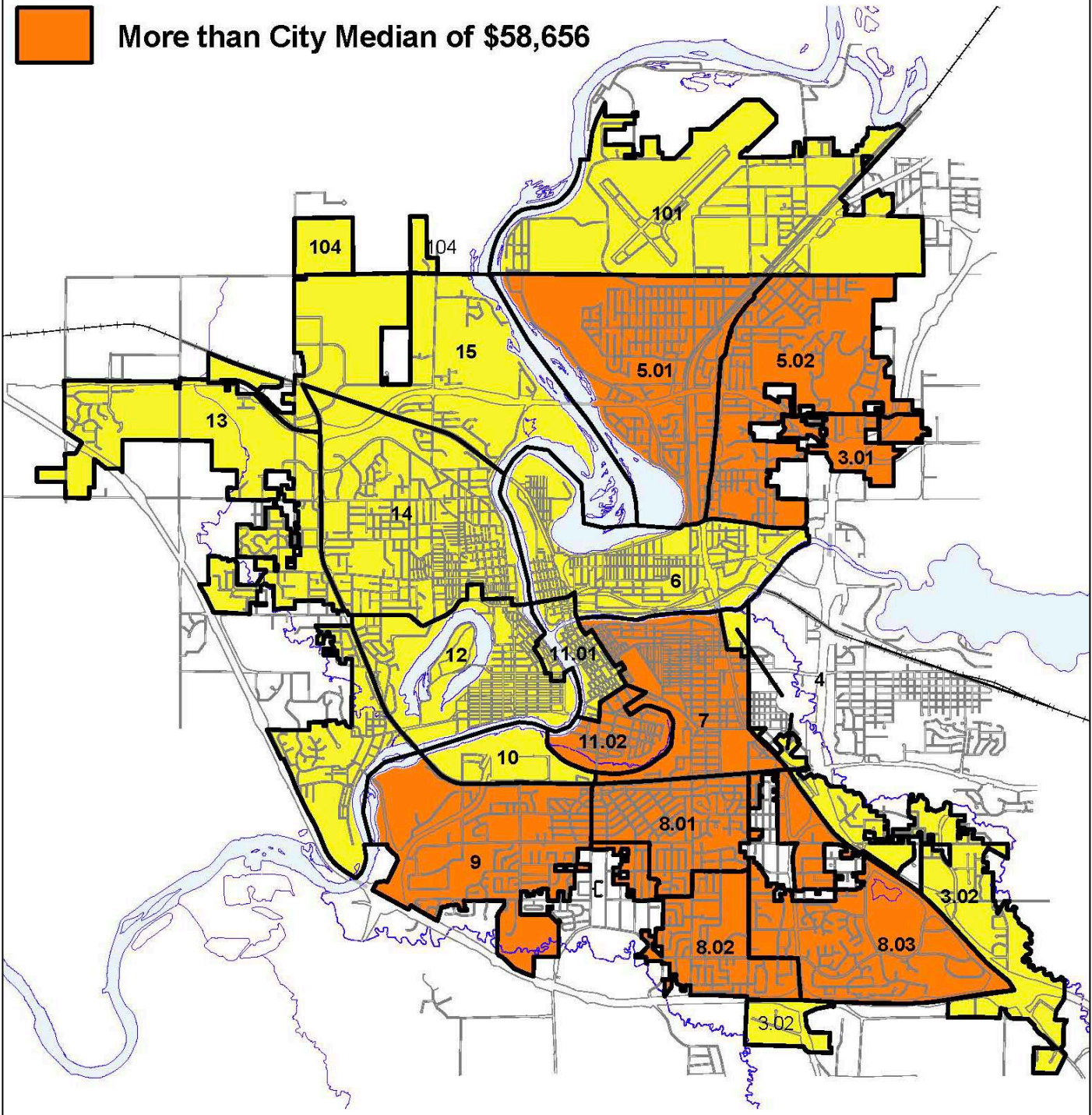

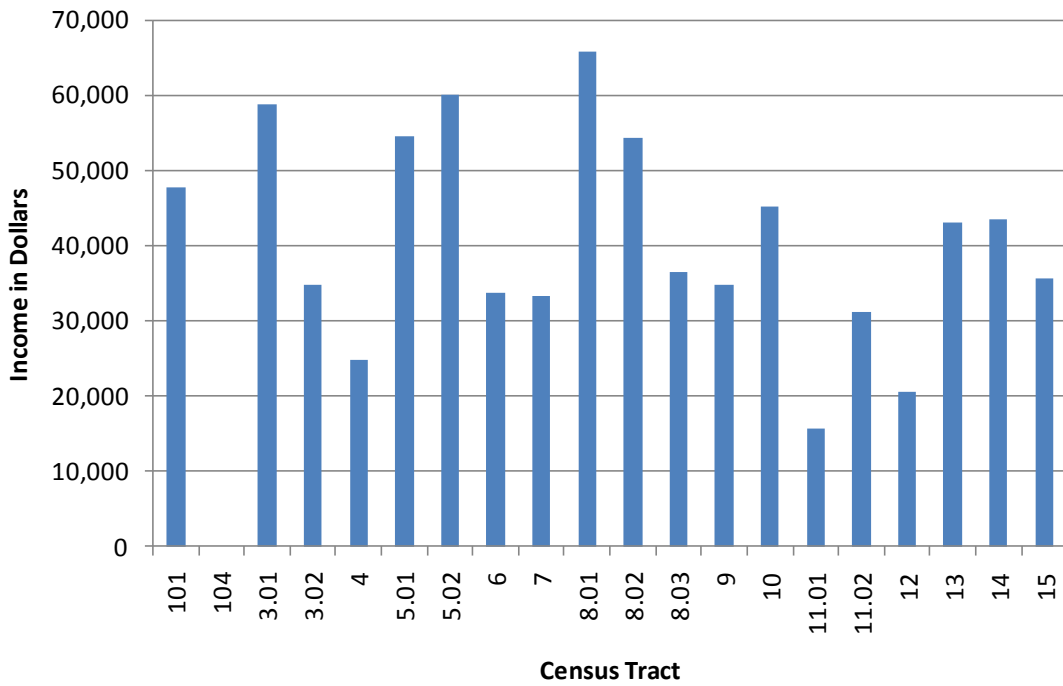

# Map 10 Median Family Income

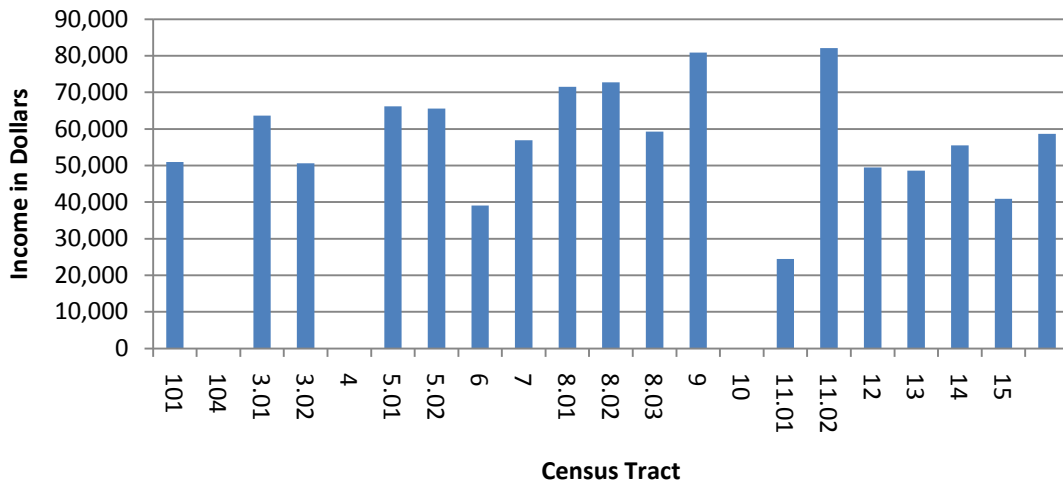

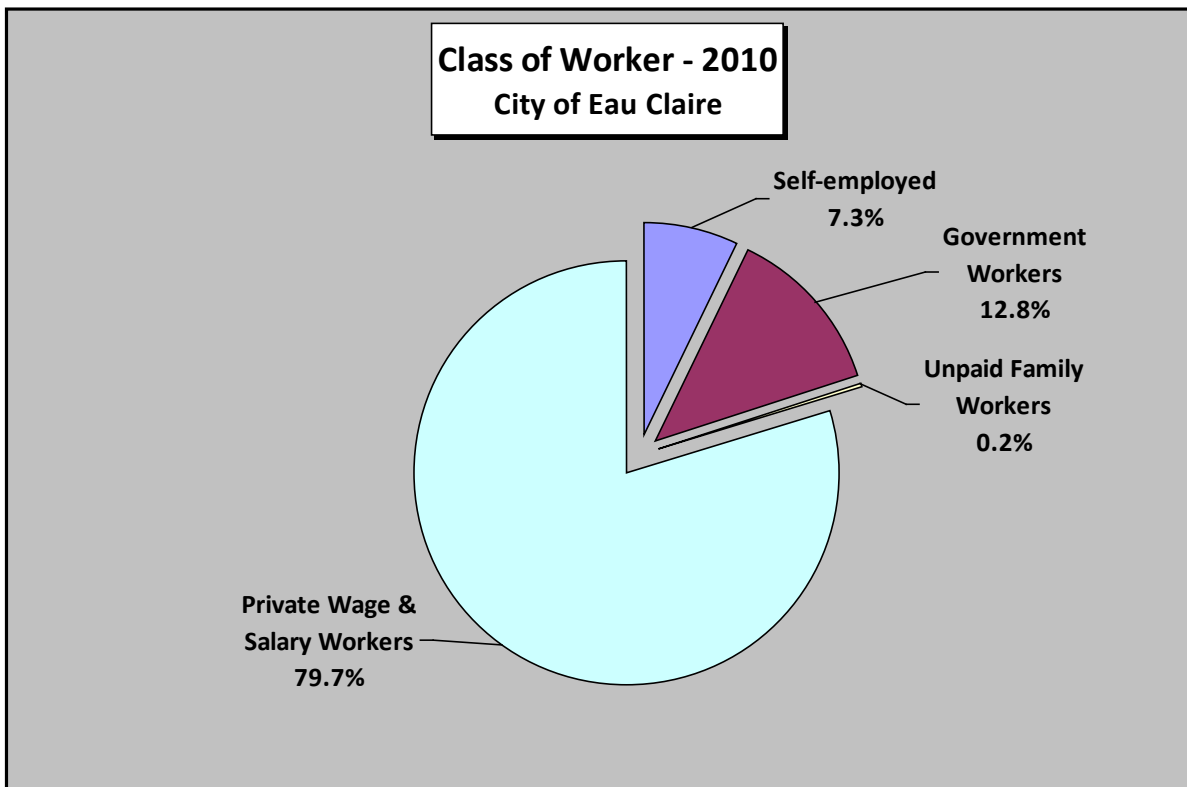
