Narrative:

The ECFD responded to a report of a structure fire. Upon arrival, flames and smoke were showing from the second floor window area in the front of the building. The First in Engine Company knocked down the bulk of the fire from the exterior and then made an interior attack. An initial report indicated all the occupants had evacuated the building. A primary search after the fire was knocked down confirmed that report.

Further investigation revealed there was fire in the walls and the attic. Fire Fighting crews were rotated into the operation until the fire was extinguished completely. The excessive heat hindered the ability of the firefighters, this shortened their ability to work at the scene before going to rehab.

The probable cause after the investigation indicated overheated electrical wires.

One Firefighter was treated on scene for heat exhaustion.
