## Narrative:

At 19:39 hours the Eau Claire Fire Department was dispatched to a plane crash at HWY 312 and McKinley Avenue. Upon arrival we found a Cessna 180 in the median of 312 just east of McKinley Ave. The pilot was out of the plane and reports no injuries.

Our investigation found moderate damage to the left wing that extended throughout the wing and into the fuselage. Damage was caused when the plane struck a traffic light at the inersection just after landing. Numerous checks were made of the pilot but he refused transport or medical evaluation.

The cause of the crash is unknown and the FAA will head-up the investigating. Initially the pilot reported that all the guages went black and he had to make a forced landing. In landing on HWY 312 the pilot narrowly missed numerous power lines, light poles and bridges.

Crews were on the scene for several hours to assist in transporting the damaged plane to Chippewa Valley Regional Airport. The plane was loaded on a flatbed wrecker and escorted by State Patol, ECPD and fire department personnel west on HWY 312 to N. Hastings then north to Melby street to the airport. All units cleared at 01:18 hours.
