Narrative:

On December 17, 2016, at 18:55, the Eau Claire Fire Department was dispatched to a residential trailer fire at 1611 Western Avenue, Lot 30. The initial dispatch stated that two children were inside the residence. Three engines, one medic unit, Duty Chief, and Battalion Chief responded. En route, the Battalion Chief requested a second alarm. A ladder truck, medic unit, and heavy rescue unit responded. The first arriving units observed turbulent, black smoke and heavy fire coming from the front entrance and kitchen windows of the residence. Fire department personnel immediately launched an offensive fire attack. The Eau Claire Police Department assisted with identifying and contacting the occupants. The Eau Claire Police Department quickly confirmed that all occupants were out of the structure. The fire was quickly confined to the structure and extinguished. Thorough salvage and overhaul operations were conducted. The Red Cross was requested and responded to provide assistance to the occupants. The exact cause and origin of the fire is under investigation.
