## Eau Claire Fire & Rescue News Media Report



## Narrative:

The Eau Claire Fire Department responded to a structure fire at 1510 E Madison Street at 1448hrs Monday afternoon. On dispatch it was reported that there were 3 people still in the home and unable to get out. On the fire departments arrival neighbors had used a ladder to assist the trapped victims from a second story balcony. Fire fighters found heavy smoke and fire coming from the rear of a residents and the first and second floors. The residence had two living units in it. The fire on the back side of the residence was extinguished. Crews made entry into the first and second floors. The fire on the first floor was quickly extinguished. Crews working on the second floor were forced out because of extreme fire and heat conditions. The fire was attacked from the exterior until conditions improved and crews were able to reenter and extinguish the fire. The American Red Cross is working with the 13 residents that were displaced because of the fire. Two residents were treated at the scene for smoke inhalation but were not transported to the hospital. The fire remains under investigation and crews will remain on the scene throughout the night. Damage is estimated to be \$140,000.
