## Eau Claire Fire & Rescue News Media Report



## Narrative:

On Sunday, April 21, the Eau Claire Fire Department was dispatched to 3219 Runway Avenue for a structure fire. Two engines, one ladder truck, one medic unit, and a Battalion Chief responded. En route to the scene, the Communication Center notified responding units that witnesses stated that fire was coming out of the front window of the residence. Upon receiving the additional information, a second alarm was promptly requested to which an additional engine, medic unit, heavy rescue, and Duty Chief responded. Upon arrival, fire crews observed heavy, black smoke and a large amount fire coming from a front bedroom window. Fire crews immediately launched an offensive fire attack. The fire was confined to one side of the duplex extinguished within approximately 35 minutes. The occupant was not home at the time of the fire; however, the occupant's cat was home and found to be deceased upon fire crew's arrival. Thorough overhaul and salvage operations were conducted and the Red Cross was requested to provide assistance to the displaced occupant. At the conclusion of the incident, the property was released to property maintenance personnel. The exact cause and origin of the fire is currently under investigation.
