

City wants your input on Wilson Park fountain replacement

Eau Claire (WQOW) - The city wants your input on what the replacement for the Wilson Park fountain should look like.

The city has set aside \$147,000 in its project budget to replace the fountain. City officials say it was installed in the 1960s and has not worked since suffering a "catastrophic" pipe failure last fall.

Because of the extent of the damage and its age, officials say it's not cost-effective to try to repair the fountain.

Instead, the city wants to know what you'd like to see as a replacement.

Four design workshops are scheduled to get input from residents. The first is next Thursday at 6:00 p.m. at city hall.
