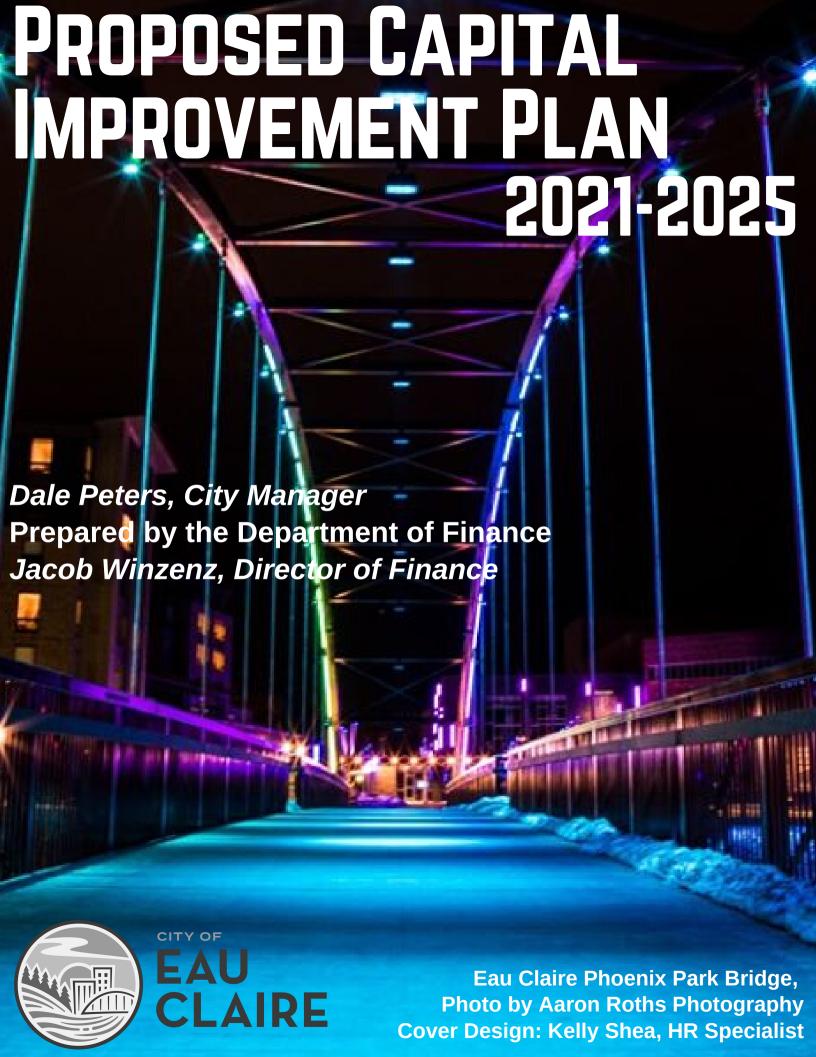

Dear Mr. Wagener:

In the interest if developing a successful Transit Development Plan for the City of Eau Claire and its partner agencies, we propose extending the project timeline so that we may adequately engage stakeholders and provide assistance to Eau Claire Transit in the area of implementation. Since COVID-19 has impacted local transit and partner agency operations, we have been unable to complete several tasks identified in our scope of work. In this document, we outline a revised scope and schedule to ensure successful outcomes. Moreover, since our work on the Transit Development Plan has started, SRF has developed proficiency in analyzing transit data and methods of online engagement. These skills will be applied to the revised scope of work outlined in the following section.

Scope of Services

Completing Base Scope of Work for Transit Development Plan

To complete the initial draft of the Transit Development Plan, we propose using the remaining project to complete the following tasks:

- Deliver Draft Transit Development Plan Service Recommendations
- Revise Draft Based on Transit Manager Comments
- Facilitate one online work session with project Steering Committee
- Facilitate one online work session with Transit Agency Supervisors and Staff

We understand that priorities may have shifted, and we can use this time to revise or add to any project goals and objectives that have arisen since that deliverable was completed.

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Additional Engagement and Implementation Assistance (Scope of Work for Optional Tasks)

As we understand the challenges and opportunities presented by restructuring a transit system and making major service changes, we offer the resources of our planning, marketing, and graphics design team to support the City of Eau Claire through the implementation phases of the TDP. The staff resources of transit systems are limited and it is our intent to stand by our work and offer assistance in delivering on recommendations. The SRF team will be available for these activities and would be proud to support the client in the implementation of project recommendations. The team provides all the skills needed for implementation, and our study results will be designed for fast and easy implementation.

The consultant team also understands that engaging the public and decisionmakers effectively will be critical to the success of the projects. To that end, we propose including the following tasks in our scope of work.

- Public Participation
 - One round of in-person public outreach to be conducted over the course of two business days in Eau Claire, Wisconsin. Per our original proposal, this includes activities described as "Pop Up Meetings" and "Interviews and Small Group Discussions" our outreach will take care to ensure participation with educational institutions and their partners. We will also engage individual Transit Commission and City Council Members as needed.
- Facilitate one (1) in-person or virtual workshop with the Transit Commission
- One (1) Presentation and/or Work Session with Eau Clare City Council
- Virtual engagement
 - One "webinar" style presentation on draft recommendations and the TDP process held via Zoom meeting to encourage public participation.
 - o SRF will host a Wikimap online as a method of gathering public comment and geographic information
- Finalize Transit Development Plan Document.
- Twice-monthly project check-in meetings

We commit to regular communication with Eau Claire Transit management to modify this scope of work as needed to accommodate issues that may arise due to COVID-19 travel restrictions or shifting agency priorities.

Assumptions

All assumptions held in agreement 2019-19 apply to this amendment, with the modifications to scope, fee, and schedule outlined herein.

Schedule

We propose completed the "Base Scope of Work" by July 31, 2020.

This proposal assumes that non-essential travel restrictions will be lifted in October 2020, and that is when in-person outreach will take place with appropriate precautions. For this reason we propose extending the contract term to complete tasks related to "Additional Engagement and Implementation Assistance" to **December 31, 2020**.

Basis of Payment/Budget

We propose to be reimbursed for our services on an hourly basis for the actual time expended. Other direct project expenses such as printing, supplies, reproduction, etc., will be billed at cost and mileage will be billed at the current allowable IRS rate for business miles. Invoices are submitted on a monthly basis for work performed during the previous month. Payment is due within 30 days.

Based on our understanding of the project and our scope of services, we estimate the cost of the requested budget amendment to be \$16,000, which includes both time and expenses.

Changes in the Scope of Services

It is understood that if the scope or extent of work changes, the cost will be adjusted accordingly. Before any out-of-scope work is initiated, however, we will submit a budget request for the new work and will not begin work until we receive authorization from you.

Standard Terms and Conditions

The Terms and Conditions outlined in agreement 2019-19 apply to this contract amendment.
