## **PROJECT OVERVIEW**

Construction on: Golf Road & Rudolph Road Round-a-bout

**Tentative start date:** Monday, August 10, 2020

**Proposed Work:** Removing and replacing concrete curb and gutter and medians that have deteriorated.

Golf Road and Rudolph Road will be closed at this intersection. A signed detour will be in place during construction.

## **DETOUR INFORMATION**

Westbound Golf Road: traffic will be detoured north on Fairfax Street to Mitscher Avenue; then west on Mitscher Avenue to Rudolph Road; then north on Rudolph Road to E. Hamilton Avenue; then west on E. Hamilton Avenue to State Street; then south on State Street to Lowes Creek Road.

Eastbound Golf Road: traffic will be detoured beginning on Lowes Creek Road at State Street; then north on State Street to E. Hamilton Avenue; then east on E. Hamilton Avenue to Rudolph Road; then south on Rudolph Road to Mitscher Avenue; then east on Mitscher Avenue to Fairfax Street; then south on Fairfax Street to Golf Road.

The detour will include a "4-way" stop sign at the intersection of Rudolph Road and Mitscher Avenue.

## **RIGHT-OF-WAY**

If you have an irrigation system in City Right-of-Way, please be sure to locate it, and remove it before the start of construction to avoid damage.

Any landscaping that is in the City Right-of-Way should be removed prior to the start of construction, as well, to avoid any damage.

The contractor and the City cannot guarantee the condition of these items once construction begins.
