NARRATIVE:			
The Eau Claire Fire Department (ECFD) responded for a sounding fire alarm. On arrival of the first fire crew, one wing of the apartment complex was filled with smoke and the incident was upgraded to a structure fire.			
Crews located and quickly extinguished a fire within a first floor apartment of the complex. As the fire was being extinguished, additional fire crews searched the immediate fire area, vented the smoke, and assisted with the evacuation of numerous tenants.			
With the quick response and actions of the firefighters, the fire was contained to one apartment and the remainder of the structure was spared.
