Description: Request of Encroachment/Improvement at 1430 Howard Drive for

Riverview Drive

Location: Riverview Drive

Background: Ms. Wilodyne Bruce, homeowner, requested permission to remove selected vegetation above Dells Pond, adjacent to 1430 Howard Ave. The project will include removal of invasive, dead and diseased trees leaving the stumps in place to help erosion control. It will also include replanting native grasses to help keep the riverbank stabilized.

Justification: Selective removal and thinning of trees and other vegetation will create a vista of Dells Pond on this portion of Riverview Rd. Maintenance work targeted for oak trees must follow best management practices to avoid oak wilt disease. The adjacent neighbors have already been approved and completed this work last month and Ms. Bruce has been approved to complete this work in the past. Black Locust and Ash are primary targeted for this removal and staff recommends this work being done. To ensure quality control, all work is to be completed by an individual or firm that employees ISA-Certified Arborists, and is licensed to apply herbicide treatment. All work will be completed under the general direction of the Forestry Division by a preapproved licensed contractor, and future maintenance to be conducted by the same.

Mission Statement: To support the beautification and awareness of local parks or trails while encouraging and recognizing neighborhood and community involvements.

Proposed Motion: I motion to approve the Tree Trimming/Removal/Planting Treatment Permit Application submitted by Ms. Bruce for the property adjacent to 1430 Howard Ave overlooking Dells Pond. The homeowner will work with the City Forestry Department and will be responsible for all cost related to this operation.

Proposed Location: Riverview Drive – adjacent to 1430 Howard Drive


Subject: Recommendation for acceptance of land along the EC River

Description: Place a skate board element adjacent to a trail section along 1st Avenue by the Court House and Police Station.

Location: Adjacent to the 1st Avenue trail by the Court House and Police Station

Background: Board Member Johnson brought up in our June meeting the idea of placing a skate park element adjacent to one of our trails. Since then Board Member Johnson and City staff determined the best location for this element is along the 1st Avenue trail adjacent to the current path close to the Court House and Police Station.

Justification: At our June meeting the Commission requested Board Member Johnson and City staff explore this option and bring it back to the board with a cost estimate and a specific location. It was determined the skate element would cost \$1,300 and a 30' x 0.5' sidewalk to offset the feature from the current trail would cost \$2,000. Board Member Johnson is actively looking for individuals who could help out with this project and would like to see it completed this fall.

Mission Statement: To support the beautification and awareness of local parks or trails while encouraging and recognizing neighborhood and community involvements.

Proposed Motion: I motion to approve this trial skate park element to be installed along 1st Avenue trail.

Proposed Location: Adjacent to the 1st Avenue Trail

August 2021 Report

Community Services Department

The Community Services Department is doing its part to slow the spread of Covid-19. Masks are
required once again regardless of vaccination status, staff are participating in the City's Vaccine
Incentive Program, and additional measures such as mandatory weekly testing are being
considered. Additionally, cancellation policies for recreation programs and facility reservations have
been relaxed temporarily to accommodate Covid-19 concerns.

Parks Division

- The Boyd Park Skate Park RFP was awarded to Spohn Ranch. Staff is now working with the Purchasing Department, Spohn Ranch, and the Eau Claire Skater's Association to secure a design for a skate park to be built in Boyd Park. The team is currently working on identifying dates and time for the community engagement process.
- Baseball Season is wrapped up and crews are cleaning and closing the Carson Park Baseball Stadium and preparing the Football Stadium for the use.
- In collaboration with the Engineering Department and Recreation Division, the Fairfax Safe Route to School project is on track to be completed before students return to the classroom.
- An irrigation control system at Phoenix Park that had been damaged in a recent lightning storm has now been replaced.

Forestry Division

- The Forestry crew continues tagging, pruning, and removing Ash Trees throughout the City.
- The Stump Grinding machine is temporarily out of service for repairs. A replacement machine is in the works for 2022.
- An order for 300 trees has been placed to prepare for the fall planting season.

Recreation Division

- National Night Out, hosted in conjunction with the Police Department, was a huge success with over 2,000 community members in attendance. Staff and guests enjoyed the new location in Carson Park immensely and look forward to using that space again in future years.
- Fairfax Pool will close for the season on August 27, 2021, save for the Doggie Swim scheduled for Sunday, August 29th
- A new recreation management software implementation is underway, with an expected switchover in September or October.
- Hobbs Ice Arena is preparing for a more regular season this fall and winter. Staffing levels are the largest concern at the moment, with an additional 14+ seasonal employees needed before the season begins.
