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Life Saving Skills: Think Ahead, Have A Plan, Be Prepared for Any Emergency

Eau Claire, WI - September 20, 2021- During National Preparedness month, the Eau Claire City-County Health Department encourages you and your family to prepare for and protect against disasters and severe weather events by learning essential life-saving skills. "As we're seeing more natural disasters, like flooding and tornados, it's important that our community builds a culture of preparedness," says Joe Kalscheur, Emergency Preparedness Specialist.

What You Should Know About Life Saving Skills:

Make an emergency kit.

- o Have emergency supplies in place at home, at work, and in the car.
- Set some money aside from your income in case of an emergency.
- o <u>Sign up with RAVE</u>, our local emergency notification system, to receive timely alerts on disasters and emergency events impacting our local community.

Be prepared for natural gas emergencies.

- o Install smoke, carbon monoxide, and natural gas alarms. Test them monthly.
- o Place natural gas detectors on every level of your home. Test them monthly.
- o Know how to turn off utilities like natural gas in your home.

• Make an emergency plan in case of fire.

- o Know two ways out of your home in the event of a fire and practice evacuation plans.
- o Talk to your landlord or building manager about evacuation routes and fire safety.
- o Eliminate common electrical and fire hazards around your house and property.

• Prepare your kids for an emergency.

- Develop and practice a family communication plan.
- o Teach kids how to respond to smoke, carbon monoxide, and natural gas alarms.

Know simple skills to help people in need until first responders arrive.

- o Life-threatening emergencies can happen fast, and emergency responders aren't always nearby.
- You may be able to save a life by taking these five simple actions immediately: call 911, stay safe, stop the bleeding, position the injured and provide comfort.
