**Background**: Amber Sirianni is working on her Eagle Scout Project and would like to place 17 trail markers along our trail system in Mt. Simon Park. Staff has reviewed the plan and is in favor of this project

# Mt. Simon Eagle Project

Hello! I am Amber Sirianni from Troop 175, and I am working on my eagle project in hopes of improving our community and bringing people outdoors. The goal of this project is to place 17 trail markers at Mt. Simon to better direct hikers and other visitors on the trail system. I started planning this project in July of 2021 and I hope to complete the project by April of 2022.

- Trail names and routes (August-October '21)
- Materials list & funding plan (August-October '21)
- Eau Claire & BSA proposal editing and approvals (October-December '21)


### Phase 2: prepping

- Eagle final paperwork


# Phase 1: trail names and routes





\*difficulty rating







Chippewa Loop




Sandstone Loop pt. 1




Dells Pond 2

I plan to use 62" Fiberglass Reinforced Polyester (FRP) composite Marker Posts (similar to carsonite, just a different company). The markers won't have any decals. Having a color for each trail marker should be adequate for the identification of trails. Paint may be used on the markers to indicate "start" and "end" of each trail. Markers will stand approximately 4' once in the ground.



I chose this material of trail marker due to its durability to withhold the weather we get in Wisconsin. I opted against wood as this would require greater upkeep and risks being damaged by younger people who visit Mt. Simon. I am purchasing these trail markers by a company located in Mesa, AZ. This is a small women-owned business and sells products to "the US Forest Service, the Bureau of Land Management, the National Park Service, many municipalities and many trail organizations."



This picture was taken at Mt. Simon near the boat landing. I would like to use some of this space to place a complete map of the trail system (similar to slide 3). The map will be printed, laminated, and hung up with the rest of the postings on the board. If there is another location in addition or instead of this board, I would love to place a map there too/instead.

# Phase 2: funding, team

### **Funding**

My funding plan is to run a garage sale through donated items. I did this last year to fund my Gold Award. I earned \$600+ and I am confident in reaching my goal of \$400 to fund my Eagle project. I have access to items needed for implementation such as shovels, gloves, safety glasses, paint, etc. through my Troop's inventory as well as volunteers who will let my team utilize any tools we need. These volunteers include Malcolm M, Brent S, Jamie G, and more.


#### Team

The team I will be leading throughout this project will be a group of volunteers from Troop 175 and potentially 30, 124, and others, as well as friends and family.

# Phase 3: trash pick-up, trail distances, implementing

### Day(s) of implementation

- 1. First on my list would be to have the team pick up trash along the trails. I will appoint younger scouts/friends accompanied by a few adults for this (at least one adult for every 3 kids as a general rule, female adult needed for female scouts/friends).
- Pacing is a scout skill that every scout from first class rank and above should know how to do. I will have the older scouts and I lead the rest of the team in learning how to calculate the (approximate) distances of each trail. All materials needed are in our Troop's and scouts' inventory.
- 3. Collectively, we will determine the difficulty of each trail by rating them between 1 and 5 stars. The trail difficulty rating will be on the complete trail map by the boat landing and/or wherever a map is needed.
- 4. Lastly, we will implement the trail markers at the indicated spots on slide 3 and post the map and key in the exact location(s) to be determined.



# Phase 3: project wrap up

#### Conclusion

This project will be led by me, a scout from troop 175, and facilitated by a team of volunteers. My goals for this project are to create an organized trail system at Mt. Simon, better my leadership skills, teach scouts and others outdoor skills, and benefit the community by giving them direction while they explore the outdoors.
