1. Call to Order & Introduction of Visitors. Chair Salmon called the virtual meeting to order at 6:05.

Item #4: 2022 CIP Projects. Staff presented a brief overview of the proposed Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) project. Many projects will be related to the replacement of existing lead utilities to utilize the remaining grants which will expire in the next year.

Item #1: CIP 2021 Project Update. Staff provided updates on current projects across the City. The High Bridge is under work with upcoming work on the middle pier and a potential complete date on March 1st.

6. <u>Discussion and Direction</u>

A. Safety Concerns. Raised the concern that the intersection at State and Garfield should have an all pedestrian phase due to a recent pedestrian vehicular crash. There is a lot of signage issues and closing down of sidewalk problems in the downtown. A committee member witnessed a collision at the Kwik Trip on Water St. and there seems to be a lot of conflict.
