







One Year Anniversary of COVID-19 vaccine given in Eau Claire County Local healthcare and public health strongly recommend vaccination

Greetings Eau Claire Community:

As we approach the two-year mark of the COVID-19 pandemic, we recognize the fatigue we are feeling as an entire community. This stems, in part, from missed events and opportunities resulting from the pandemic. Many of us have also suffered losses of friends and family members during this time, and that loss is magnified during the holiday season.

Despite these challenges, on December 17th we will celebrate the one-year anniversary of vaccines being available in Eau Claire County to help save lives and prevent major illness caused by COVID-19. More than 120,000 doses have been given to Eau Claire County residents in this time.

As healthcare providers and public health workers, patient care and community health continue to be our top priority. We are thankful to be your trusted source of information when it comes to caring for the health of your family on any topic. This year, we strongly encourage you to protect yourself and your family from COVID-19 by getting a vaccine or booster dose as soon as you are eligible. This includes school-age children as young as five years old. Nearly 1 in 4 children aged 5-11 have already been vaccinated in Eau Claire County. Being fully vaccinated:

- Protects you or your child from serious illness caused by COVID-19
- Makes you less likely to spread COVID-19 to others in your home and community
- Minimizes the time you may need to spend in quarantine if someone near you tests positive
