- 1. Meeting Called to Order at 7:04pm by Commissioner Ball

Description: Recommend approval of the Conceptual Plan for the Cannery Park

Location: Cannery Park off of Oxford and Maple

Background: In 2021, the City of Eau Claire entered into an agreement with Confluence to design Cannery Park, this agreement included Confluence to conduct public input meetings, surveys and stakeholder meetings to gather information to see how the park would be designed. A major focus of the planning process was to engage the public through a community survey and meetings with various groups who utilize the park. These meetings were conducted in the fall of 2021 and ran through December. Confluence has provided a summary of community engagement efforts and a preferred conceptual park drawing of the Cannery Park. Input from these stakeholder meetings, citizens survey, staff input and online comments were coalesced to produce the final recommendations.

Justification: Cannery Park will replace Kessler Park which is a vital Park in the Upper Westside Neighborhood of Eau Claire. This park will need to be a neighborhood park first, but we also realize that this area along the Chippewa River will bring in a variety of people from outside the neighborhood. As good stewards of this park and our park system, it is our responsibility to plan for the neighborhood needs and visitor's needs as we design this park. Confluence's conceptual plan is a representation of the input from our neighborhood, user groups, community surveys and staff input.

Mission Statement: To support the beautification and awareness of local parks or trails while encouraging and recognizing neighborhood and community involvement.

Proposed Motion: I propose we approve the Conceptual Plan of Cannery Park and send it to the Planning Commission and City Council for review and approval

Proposed Location: Cannery Park – Oxford Ave, and Maple Street

Facilities Features: Conceptual Plan for Cannery Park

Storm Water: No impact at this time


City of Eau Claire Park and Open Space Master Plan: Goal "C" subsection 3: "Promote joint public-private ventures in developing park and waterway facilities"


City Comprehensive Plan: Consistent with the Comprehensive Plan.

Financial: The City budgeted 3.4 million dollars for the construction of Cannery Park in the 2022 and 2023 Capital Improvement Plan.
















DON'T DUPLICATE/ PREFER CONCEPT 2


