4. Public Discussions

Item #1: 2022 Bike Week Discussion. Chair Salmon not present to discuss. Staff will get information to pass along to the committee regarding opportunities to volunteer during bike week.

Item #3: Mobility Trends. Group discussed the rising use of E-bikes throughout the community. Inquired about including E-bike charging in future parks projects or requiring it with new development. Also discussed a mobile app for trail users that shows user location and information on trails.

Item #4: Pedestrian Survey Review. Input was that the survey was done very well. Wanted to see questions about E-bikes and alternate modes of transportation being used (skateboards, roller blades, scooters, etc.)

Item #1: Street Art Update. Staff is waiting on some information to include in the FAQ portion of the documents and will finalize the policy once that information is received.

6. <u>Discussion and Direction</u>

A. Safety Concerns. Kwik Trip on Water Street sees a lot of vehicle trips with high pedestrian usage on the sidewalk crossing the entrance/exit drives. Menomonie Street and 6th Avenue pedestrian ramp always has vehicles parked extremely close and sight triangle is blocked for bicyclists wishing to exit the trail and use the street.
