


The City is proposing to offer fare-free passes to people experiencing homelessness. Transportation is a vital resource for our homeless community to seek and maintain jobs, find housing, and attend medical and other needed appointments. Over the last year, a program offering monthly vouchers, funded in part with ARPA funds and the community, has proven the service valuable to the community.


Since mid-April, the City and Library staff worked on a plan to be able to track vouchers distributed. Individuals were allowed on voucher a month. The vouchers were priced at the low-income rate. Information matching the self-reporting application was entered into a database and shared with Transit. Additional information was gathered helping us review the use of the vouchers. We found that the vouchers were utilized for the intended goals of the program (housing, health, and employment).

Approximately 100 vouchers a month were being used. As numbers slightly increase, limitations were added over the summer. Individuals were allowed a total of 3 vouchers unless they could verify employment, actively searching for employment or housing, medical or other appointments. The past nine months with the additional limitations, the program has averaged 75 vouchers a month.

We would like to make available up to 125 vouchers a month. While we don't expect 125 to be used a month, we know there have been some population increases. The program will continue to collect data and if needed place limitations during summer months as was previously done. We will continue to share data with Transit as required for low-income passes and can share utilization data as requested.

I know in the past when we have sponsored free fare days it's had to be approved by the commission and then the City Council I believe.
