NARRATIVE:

On Tuesday April 16th, at approximately 0327hrs the Eau Claire Fire Department responded to 1211 State St for a report of fire and smoke in a building. Engine 2 was the first arriving fire unit and found a detached garage behind the apartment with heavy smoke showing. Crews had to force entry into the garage and were quickly able to locate and extinguish the fire while additional crew performed search and ventilation. 3 Engines, 1 Ladder Truck, 2 Ambulances and 2 Chiefs responded to the call. No injuries were reported at the time of this report. The cause of was accidental and identified as recreational camp fire container that had not been properly extinguished.

The fire department was assisted by the Eau Claire Police Department and the Eau Claire Communication Center.
