Event Overview: Downtown Eau Claire, Inc. would like to host A Grand Evening on the Bridge on Wednesday, August 14th. This event features a meal prepared by local restaurants served on the Grand Avenue pedestrian bridge deck, with Phoenix Park Pavilion as a rain location. This

event is expecting 185 attendees; will charge an entry fee or admission; will close City trails; serve or sell food or concessions; and serve alcohol. This is a repeat event.
