- 5. Business Item (Action Required)
  - d. Approve 2025 Health Department Fees overview of all ECCCHD fees
    - Fee amounts change either up or down depending on many factors. Examples include staffing, how time is allocated and how finance looks at allocating dollars that come in.
    - While individual fees may go down, the incoming revenue is built into the budget process.
    - DSPS does not allow indirect costs to be included in the fees.
    - Regular changes within businesses effect the amount of fee. Since we are not allowed to make
      any profit being a government agency, when we have a lot more facilities paying fees related to
      changes, we may be increasing revenue to a profit which is not allowed and we are accounting
      for this more specifically.
    - Medicaid reimbursement does not cover the costs/fees associated with programs such as Reproductive Health, and PNCC.
    - Recommend approval City of Eau Claire fees related to health department
      - o City fees (beekeeping, poultry, massage, housing) we are recommending approval

- 7. Other information items from staff for the Board
  - a. Health Department Report
    - There have been a few positive pertussis cases.
    - There has been measles cases in the Twin Cities, but none in Wisconsin at this point.
    - Medication drop boxes continue to be supported by the Health Department.
    - Suicide prevention handout updates-link was emailed to Board of Health members.
    - There is a lot of interest in PFAS and well testing efforts.
  - b. 2025 Budget Update
    - We continue to make updates to the 2025 budget.
    - Tax levy was slightly different than what the estimates were in July. This was due to net new construction final results from the State.
    - Waiting for the City/County budgets to come out so that we can finalize levy.

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- The County has indicated that they will be giving us flat funding. The result to our budget would be close to a \$90K decrease in funding if this is happening.
- We are at a deficit in the 2025 budget. It appears at this time that over \$100k from the fund balance would be used. This is not an unusual starting point for the budget.
- The County will be having public hearings in September to talk about their 2025 budgets.
- c. Performance Management Update
  - The measures are part of our overall performance management plan.
  - The measures were updated last year.
  - The data is for the first half of 2024.
  - Each division had input from staff members.
  - Discussion about number and importance of measures and the other programmatic measures that exist.
- d. Eau Claire Health Alliance Update
  - The Community Health Assessment -hard copies were given to Board of Health members.
  - The action team groups will use the assessment to see what they want to focus on for their core areas.

  - a. Quarterly review of BOH Priorities
    - This is the quarterly inclusion of board of health priorities.
    - The plan ends at the end of 2024. More discussion before the end of the year on what the next step is.

    - New Policy and Budget priorities are not available yet.

      - (1) The City passed their Capital Improvement Plan
      - (2) \$486K forestry grant from the DNR was received.

      - (1) Dr. Hirsch is not at the meeting to provide update
      - (2) The County Board considered a mental health resolution. There is a gap in services from the recent health care center closures.
    - Ground Water Advisory Committee: <u>Groundwater Advisory | Eau Claire County (eau-</u>claire.wi.us)
      - (1) The Army Corp of Engineers are working on water flow issues.
      - (2) Chippewa Valley Sewer Plan hasn't been updated since 2007. They are looking at updating that.
    - Opioid Settlement Task Force: Opioid Task Force
      - (1) There is a meeting in September
      - (2) The group will be moving forward with some more specific plans.
