## **Narrative:**

Eau Claire Fire and Rescue was dispatched to 700 Short St. in the City of Eau Claire for two canoeists in distress. This was reported by a kayaker who attempted to make a rescue. Eau Claire Fire and Rescue responded with three fire trucks with boats, Squad with dive team and two Ambulances.

Fire units reported to Hobbs boat landing and 700 Short St where command was established and immediately launched three boats. All three boats searched areas south of the Short St Bridge where the canoeists was last seen.

Township Fire assisted with the search responding with two boats and searching primarily south of the I94 Bridge to the Eau Claire County line. Mayo Two Helicopter assisted in searching for the canoeists as well. Several firefighters and police officers search the area by foot.

Eau Claire Fire Boats and Crews remained on the water for approximately 5 hours. Firefighters were hindered by high and swift water conditions throughout their search. Crews were unable to locate the canoeists or the canoe.

Eau Claire Police Department is investigating the incident.
