## **Narrative:**

Engine 2 and Battalion 1 responded to the 200 block of Fifth Avenue for a natural gas main that had been struck. Arrival finds a 4" main that had been struck by a backhoe doing utilities work. Xcel Energy was already on the scene working to contain the leak. Engine 5 was dispatched for additional assistance. Engine 2 crew stood by while Xcel clamped the leak. Engine 5 crew worked on evacuation of buildings 1/2 block in each direction. Once the leak was clamped and secured, buildings in the vicinity were checked for hazardous atmosphere. All units then cleared the scene.
