### **Narrative:**

The ECFD responded to a report of a structure fire. Upon arrival there was smoke coming from a second story bedroom window of a side by side duplex.. A report from an ECPD Officer on scene stated the occupant from the involved side of the duplex had escaped from the build and my need medical attention. A Paramedic ambulance was assigned to investigate. The Occupant was treated and released on scene. There was no fire spread in the uninvolved side of the duplex and no one was home.

The first arriving engine deployed a 1.75' hose line and advanced to the second floor. The fire was extinguished with no spread to the attic or other areas on the second floor. The remainder of the time on scene was devoted to making sure there were no more hot spots and investigating the cause of the fire. As of the time of this report a Fire Investigator is still on scene and the last engine left the scene at 10:06.
